Heidi's Reflections for August

When I attended an intensive summer session at Wartburg Seminary in July, I took two classes. Some of my classmates too many, in my opinion—told painful stories about congregations and parishes in conflict.

Comparatively, the people of Fields of Grace are—for the most part—stable, healthy, reasonable, and good-humored.

Why is that so? Did FOG have leaders who set a tone for the parish that continues today? Is it because so many people are related? Is this still the honeymoon period for me? Am I just not hearing the grumbling? Or is it something else? Am I not articulating the prophetic challenges of the gospel? Am I watering down the gospel message into a slow, manageable drip, instead of the knock-you-off-balance, raging fire hose that the gospel really is?

I talked to my supervising pastor about it, and I started reading more about the role of a pastor. I found one pastoral leader who came up with a top 10 list (a la David Letterman) of ways we all water down the gospel. I want to share it with you because I think he has some important insights from which we can all learn.

- 10. We water down the gospel when we attempt to live it out in isolation, instead of in the context of community.
- 9. We water down the gospel when we make it about changing someone else, instead of first changing ourselves.
- 8. We water down the gospel when we make it sound like following Jesus is easy (Spoiler Alert...it's not!).
- 7. We water down the gospel when we exclude people.
- 6. We water down the gospel when we tell people it's clear and simple.
- 5. We water down the gospel when we eliminate the centrality of social justice.
- 4. We water down the gospel when we explain away the whole nonviolent love of enemies part.
- 3. We water down the gospel when we over emphasize sins rarely mentioned in scripture, while conveniently neglecting the ones that are talked about constantly.
- 2. We water down the gospel when we exclusively use the concept of "[punitive] substitution" to explain the gospel.
- 1. We water down the gospel when we invite people to trust Jesus for the afterlife... but not this life.
