Heidi's Reflections

CNN recently published an article entitled "Ten reasons Americans go to church—and nine reasons they don't." The study suggests that there is an under-served group of believers "who seem like they'd actually like to go to religious services—if only someone could help get them there and welcome them when they arrive."

I'm going to write a "Light for the Way" article about this for an upcoming issue of the *Lafayette Nicollet Ledger* but, for the purpose of this newsletter, I simply want to say: this is one of the reasons why FOG is hosting Good Neighbor Sunday on September 9.

There are many families—and older adults, too—who live in the Lafayette area who have no church home.

According to the CNN article, we just need to invite them and/or help them get to church, and then welcome them. One church consultant who surveyed guests at many congregations found that church members perceive their church to be friendly, but the guests typically saw church members as unfriendly. That chasm makes all the difference.

As witnesses to God, in Christ through the Holy Spirit, it is our "duty and our joy" (as I say in the Holy Communion liturgy) to extend hospitality to all people, especially our neighbors. I hope that y'all will show up on Sunday, September 9, for worship at 10:30 a.m. and lunch at noon with our neighbors! And don't come alone. Invite your neighbor to come with you!

Christian education at Fields of Grace

Church as we knew it in rural, central Minnesota is changing. One of the traditions that has long been meaningful is Sunday School. Gone are the days when children come flooding into the building, eager to join their peers in grade-based classrooms distinguished by colorful posters on the walls, boxes of crayons next to bibles, next to cardboard offering boxes on the shelves, and the sound of joyful music in the air.

Now there aren't enough children per grade to create separate classrooms and, even if there were, there are few-to-no adults willing to teach. The children who do come to Sunday School on Sunday morning are often dropped off by parents or grandparents, they are tired and distracted, and many can only come when it is their weekend to be with mom or dad who are divorced and sharing custody. I'm not judging that reality, just stating it.

Even in light of these challenges, there still is a deep desire to pass the beloved Christian faith on to the next generation, and to see them carry it into the future. How will Fields of Grace do that faithfully?

First, we will acknowledge reality. Here is what I know:

- 1) There are no children at Swan Lake
- 2) There are 18 (or so) children pre-K through grade five who have been affiliating with First Lutheran
- 3) There is one fourth grader at Bernadotte, and three younger children whose parents have weekend responsibilities meaning they can't attend regularly.

So here is how we have decided to serve the children and families of our parish, and others who are curious about the Christian faith and way of life.

Carmen Broste has agreed to teach children in grades 1-4 on Sunday mornings at First Lutheran. We are looking for someone to teach children pre-school through kindergarten at First Lutheran. We have designed a schedule of four- to five-week blocks. If you are willing to teach for one or more blocks, please let Carmen (507-276-3179) or Heidi (507-766-2729) know sooner rather than later!

Bernadotte will have Family Faith Night on a semi-regular basis. The families with young children will meet with Heidi to share a meal, a lesson, and a fun, faith-forming activity. When that schedule is determined, we will let the whole parish know the details.

Wednesday School

The learning and fellowship opportunity for students in grades 5-9 will start September 19. Fifth and sixth graders will meet with Mark Haler, youth worker, for a kind of pre-Confirmation learning opportunity, and Heidi will teach the Confirmation students in grades 7-9. The Wednesday night option will be held at First Lutheran. Young people are welcome to arrive at 5:00 p.m. A simple meal will be served at 5:30. Class will start at 6:00 p.m., followed by worship at 7:00 p.m. The evening will conclude at 7:30 p.m.

Parents/grandparents and other adults are welcome to join us for the meal and worship. Adults are also welcome to observe the classes.

Families of children preschool through grades nine will receive a letter from Heidi by the end of August with the full schedule.

Teachers needed

Can't see yourself making a commitment to teach Sunday School for nine months? Can you commit to teaching children for four or five weeks? FOG has organized the Sunday School year into four- or five-week blocks.

The first block is just five weeks—September 16, 23, 30, October 7, 14. The second block is just four weeks—October 28, November 4, 11, 18.

Starting in mid-November, most of the class time at First Lutheran will include preparing for the Christmas Program, and Carmen Broste will direct those sessions. The Sunday School Christmas Program will take place during worship at First Lutheran on December 9.

Just One Life Matters program at Hector Sunday, September 9

Suicide is the second leading cause of death of persons ages 10 to 34. In response, the Buffalo Lake-Hector-Stewart pastors and ministry leaders have begun a conversation with the school district regarding depression, mental health, and suicide.

Just One Life Matters, a suicide prevention event, will be held at BLHS High School in Hector Sunday, September 9 from 6:30 to 8 p.m. The program will include Hip-hop artist Kaboose, regional and national suicide prevention resources,

and Sam Eaton, founder of Recklessly Alive Ministries, who will share his story about the day suicide didn't win.

Though the subject matter is a tender topic for some, people who have attended Just One events leave uplifted, educated, and more prepared to continue the conversation about suicide, depression, and mental health.

The event is free and open to the public. There will be door prizes and snacks.
