Pastor Heidi's Reflections

I am writing this the week before Holy Trinity Sunday, the week when we focus on the mysterious community of God whom we call Father, Son and Holy Spirit, or Creator, Redeemer, Sustainer. The lessons this year include a very brief reading from Paul's letter to the Romans:

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has

been given to us. (Romans 5:1-5)

This text hits many of the high points of God's Trinitarian salvation of humanity. We read of the Father's love, the grace of Jesus Christ, and the abiding Spirit. Is that the entirety of the Trinity? Of course not! But it's not a bad start—and we don't have to get into weighty metaphysical matters to see the Triune God's love at work here.

This promise is made particularly meaningful for me this year as it comes at a time when I am walking with several people who are suffering, some unto death. What a beautiful reminder that, as people of faith, we can celebrate the depth and breadth of God's love for us—the love of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit even in the midst of suffering.
