Now that St. Gregory the Great has closed, the event will rotate between First and Bernadotte Lutheran Churches.

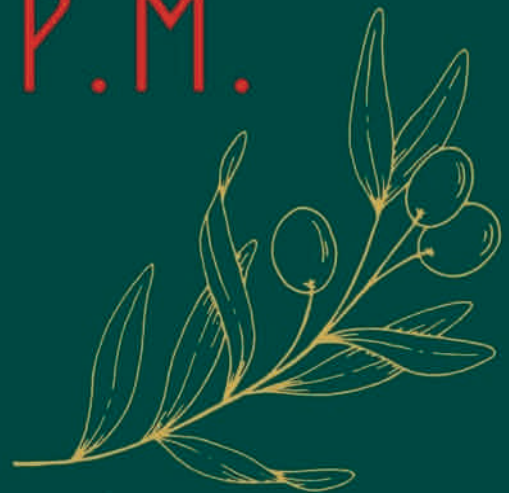
