## What is my response? by Pastor Bob Stover

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love. Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is doubt, faith. Where there is despair, hope. Where there is darkness, light. And where there is sadness, joy."

This became the prayer of St Francis, because in the Middle Ages he saw a lot of hatred, injury, doubt, despair, and sadness. The crusades, pestilence, and famines were happening, so he had to have wondered what could possibly combat these strong evil forces of the world. To sow love, pardon, faith, hope, and joy seemed naive to many. But yet Francis believed, in spite of the darkness, the light of Christ could prevail.

We live in an interesting age right today. There is plenty of conflict, hatred, fear, and confusion. It is easy to find ourselves giving in to those strong evil forces, resigning to just "hanging in there" or "going with the flow." But yet, in the midst of it, the world hungers for words of encouragement, forgiveness, understanding, and compassion. St Francis's prayer culminates by asking God to help him rise above a self-centered existence, to be more Christ-like, and to be a sign of Jesus' light to the world-

"O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood, as to understand; to be loved, as to love. For it is in giving that we receive, and it's in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it's in dying that we are born to Eternal Life. Amen."

My prayer for myself and the people of the Fields of Grace Parish is the same as St Francis, that as we encounter the forces of darkness in our days, we would call upon the light of Christ to shine instead. And when we are tempted to make our lives all about ourselves, that we would reach out to others in their needs. The world right now desperately needs consolation, understanding, and love. God has blessed us with so much, in order that we may be a blessing to the world.

So, in the weeks and months ahead, no matter what this life continues to throw at us, let's make certain that the people of Fields of Grace be about the business of forgiving and sacrificing ourselves for others. For in doing so, we offer Christ crucified and risen to the world. In doing so, "we are born to eternal life."

Bernadotte native and BLC confirmand Britta (Monson) Fisher has been named the new CEO of Colorado Coalition for the Homeless. Britta has led Denver's Department of Housing Stability, the city's housing



agency, since it was created in 2019. She will end her mayoral appointment as the city's chief housing officer on February 1 and will start with the Coalition toward the end of March.

Britta is the daughter of Denise Monson Alms and the late Mark Monson.

In a Facebook post, Britta's sister, Bri (Monson) Miller commented, "My sister has always had great organization, public speaking, and leadership skills. She has put them to work in her career. It was just announced that she'll be having her dream job in the organization she started her career in almost two decades ago. She is returning to Colorado Coalition for the Homeless with great experience and skills to lead the nonprofit into its fourth decade of providing housing, healthcare, and supporting services to Coloradoans in need."
