Sowing Seeds of Grace

Several times each week, I sit down in front of my smart phone camera and record a devotional time on our Facebook page (Fields of Grace MN) that I call "Seeds of Grace." I read a selection from a book, share a scripture or two, sing a song, and close with a prayer.

Of course, its name is derived from "Fields of Grace," our cooperative parish of First of Lafayette, Swan Lake, and Bernadotte Lutheran churches. It is meant to help our members to get to know their pastor, and for me to touch base with people in other ways beside Sunday worship.

I've never asked anyone who created the parish name Fields of Grace, but I assume it was chosen for several reasons. 1) Our churches are meant to be fertile places where lives of grace are nurtured through the sharing of the gospel of Jesus Christ. 2) An embracing of our agricultural prairie setting.3) It also brings to mind the many farming analogies that Jesus made in his ministry, such as "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." (Lk 9:62)

I chose the name Seeds of Grace, for the devotion I share with you, for much of those same reasons. One scripture that particularly comes to mind is Jesus' Parable of the Sower, "A farmer went out to sow his seed..." (Mt 13:3-23). My prayer for each person who listens to one of these devotions is that it would be a seed that would take root and produce a crop; that it would bring hope to someone on an otherwise bleak day; that it would find good soil in a listener's heart to grow greater love in their life; and that it might sometimes break the stone away, as the journey of faith is a long one.

I hope and pray that your Fields of Grace parish, and all its individual churches, do become like seeds of grace that nurture you in your faith. May some of those seeds of grace "yield a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."

Thank you for the opportunity to be part of your life as your pastor, seeking to sow some of those seeds of grace in your heart.


Hamming it up at Ham Bingo

Ham Bingo, put on by the Fields of Grace youth, Saturday, April 1, was a big success.







Kidz meals at Bernadotte Lutheran Church Sunday morning, April 16.

The 45 volunteers packed 79 boxes that contained 2,844 bags of food—or 17,064 meals. And, they donated more than \$3,500 to the program—with about \$500 of that coming from individual donations and the rest from church organizations.

After an absence of five years, the Vettern choir from Jonkoping, Sweden returned to Berna-




