## New historic piece added to BLC collection

A small ceramic piece, measuring four-and-a-quarter inches wide by three inches tall, has been added to the historical items displayed in the Bernadotte church office. It was located and purchased from an antique dealer and donated to the church recently.

Although there is no date on the item, it is from 1940 or earlier as the church name imprinted on it is "Swedish Lutheran Evangelical Church, Bernadotte, Minn."

In 1940, the congregation accepted a new constitution, as proposed by the Evangelical Lutheran Augustana Synod of North America. It changed the church name to Bernadotte Evangelical Lutheran Church of Bernadotte Township.

#### **Carpe Diem** by Pastor Bob Stover

Seize the day, seize whatever you can 'Cause life slips away just like hourglass sand Seize the day, pray for grace from God's hand Then nothing will stand in your way. "Seize the day" song by Carolyn Arends

The Latin phrase "carpe diem," which literally means "pluck the day," was used by the Roman poet Horace to express the idea that we should enjoy life while we can. His full injunction, "carpe diem quam minimum credula postero," can be translated as "pluck the day, trusting as little as possible in the next one," but carpe diem alone has come to be used as shorthand for this entire idea, which is more widely known as "seize the day."

By the meteorological calendar, summer was half over at July 15. By the astronomical calendar, we will reach the middle of summer around August 6. However you look at it, the hot and sunny days of the year are ticking away quickly. It won't be long before you look back and wonder where it went. So, if you want to do some camping, bicycling, boating, or any other warm weather activity, those days are limited. You better make your plans now and do those things that you've been putting off.

I think it's the same with our Christian life. It's easy to

fool ourselves into thinking that there will always be tomorrow to do whatever is important or worthwhile. But, the truth is, we don't know what tomorrow will bring. We don't know if later we will have the strength, the resources, the time, or even the will to do acts of kindness, offer a helping hand, or provide for someone's needs. Thus, we need to "seize the day."

I believe the Christ-filled journey is a joyful life. God wants it to be abundant and full. A favorite quote of my mother-in-law, Claire Anderson, was something said by Jonathon Edwards:

# God is not glorified most by being known, nor dutifully obeyed. God is most glorified in being enjoyed.

We seize the day as we enjoy the journey of living out the Christ-filled life—as we seek to love one another as Christ has loved us. As we use our resources to try to outgive God and be a blessing to others. As we share the grace and peace of God wherever we encounter chaos and despair. I hope you enjoy every last day of summer, drinking in the long warm days and refreshing cool evenings. And I pray that you also enjoy your relationship with God, who wants your life to be richly abundant and satisfying, full of peace, joy, and love. Carpe diem!
