Sandy is survived by her husband, Jeff; daughters, Kaitlin, Jenna, and Addison; and other family members. The Donnays have been members of First Lutheran since September 2019.

Sandy was born in Germany, and later moved to Canada, then to Wisconsin, Missouri, and Mississippi before coming to Minnesota in 1977, first living at Buffalo Lake and later at Stewart and Lafayette.

Sandy worked at the Hutchinson Medical Center and at the New Ulm Medical Center as a diagnostic sonographer. She also had her own business with partner and friend, Jolene Field O'Hare, called Complete Relocation out of Lafayette.



It was Bernadotte day at the county fair farm program

The Sjostrom family of Bernadotte Township was recognized as Nicollet County Farm Family of the Year at the farm and senior program at the Nicollet County Fair August 11. In the same program, Ruth Klossner was recognized as the county's Outstanding Senior Woman.

In 1980, when Steve was just 19 years old, Lowell and Steve Sjostrom formed the "Sjostrom Farms" partnership. Prior to that Lowell and Adrianne milked 65 cows. With the new partnership the herd was increased to 80 cows, while continuing to farm approximately 500 acres. Although Lowell is now semiretired, he still works on the dairy about eight hours/day, and usually seven days a week.

Steve and Deb keep the farm running, and son Jacob has joined the operation. The dairy herd is now near 100 animals and they farm 900 acres of corn, soybeans, and alfalfa. The family raises their own, as well as purchased dairy steers. With Jacob's help, they do a fair share of custom work including round baling, silage harvesting, and trucking.

Off the farm jobs include Deb as postmaster in Winthrop, Jacob doing additional trucking, and his wife Lindsay is a busy realtor. Adrianne has long retired from daily milking but she and Lowell continue to live on her family's "Sesquicentennial Farm" just north of Bernadotte where she enjoys gardening, and

baking.

In addition to son, Jacob, the Sjostroms have two older children, Megan (Karl) and family reside in Champlin, and Lucas (Alise) and family live in rural Brooten. Steve and Deb have seven grandchildren, six of them boys.

The Sjostroms enjoy being part of the community, being involved in a number of organizations—Bernadotte Lutheran Church, Nicollet County ADA, Nicollet County DHIA, Lafayette Lions. Heartland Ethanol Board, and Bernadotte Town Board.
