A cord of three strands is not easily broken

Two are better than one,
because they have a good return for their labor:
If either of them falls down,
one can help the other up.
But pity anyone who falls
and has no one to help them up...
Though one may be overpowered,
two can defend themselves.
A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.
(Ecclesiastes 4:9-10, 12)

Whoever wrote the Bible book we call Ecclesiastes knew a great truth about life: We need each other! As he (or she) wrote in the verses above, two workers can help ensure that the boss won't be able to take advantage of either of them for their labor. If one worker tires, the other will be right there to help them back on their feet. A person on their own might get overpowered, but two people together can join forces for their defense.

Plus, notes the author in the final verse above, THREE is even better than two! To prove it, the author points us to the example of a cord...a rope. If the rope is woven from three strands, breaking it will be especially difficult, if not downright impossible. And so it is with people—if you form a group of three, that trio is far more likely to be an unstoppable force together than they could ever be separately or even as a duo!

I chose the verses above for a simple, but profound, reason: This passage from Ecclesiastes reminds me of Fields of Grace. The three 'cords' of our parish—Swan Lake, First, and Bernadotte—makes each of our three churches much stronger, and

affords us the possibility of being an unstoppable force together.

One goal I hope to accomplish during my time with you as your interim pastor is to encourage all of the parishioners in our three congregations to dream big dreams, and to realize that being a part of the trio known as Fields of Grace opens up immense possibilities. Individually, our individual churches are small—but collectively we are actually quite a bit bigger than a number of the congregations in many of the towns around us!

To unleash our full potential requires a different way of thinking, though. When contemplating projects, we need to ask, "Is this something that we could—and perhaps, should—be doing at a parish level?" I wonder how many potentially great undertakings have failed to materialize because we might have thought only in terms of our individual congregation and concluded "We could never do this because we are too small." I am convinced, if we continue to strive to think more at the parish level, our list of ministries would skyrocket and our impact would grow substantially. Not only would we accomplish more as a parish, but I also believe each individual congregation would discover more energy and more joy (and more participation) in the process. It would be the classic 'win-win' situation!

So, dear friends, let us together commit ourselves to take far more advantage of our 'big-ness' (collectively) than ever before. I issue this challenge to you: Can we add one or two ministries at the parish level during my time with you that will make a difference in the lives of God's people, whether locally or far away? Remember, Fields of Grace is a three-strand 'cord'—and a cord of three strands is not easily broken!
