Many positives exist at Fields of Grace

I got to thinking the other night, "What would I say in an email to a minister who was considering interviewing for the open pastoral call at Fields of Grace?" My article this month is what I would want to convey to him or her.

Hello Pastor! I understand you have expressed an interest in the Fields of Grace Parish. As you know, I am currently serving as the interim pastor at Fields of Grace, and have been there since the beginning of 2024. I hope my thoughts in this email will prove useful to you as you discern your next call to serve God's church.

First of all, the Lord God is active at Fields of Grace. Faith matters to the people who attend these three churches, as clearly evidenced by their resilience during these days where the church in general is struggling. They want their church parish to have a future, and thus are well-committed in the present to make sure that God's work continues in this lovely, rural farming area.

Let me assure you that the people who make up this parish are amongst the kindest and most thoughtful folks I have encountered during my eight interim calls. From day one, I was made to feel welcome—and they have been wonderfully accommodating not only to my needs, but also the needs of my wife and our extended family. I cannot overstate how much you will come to love the parishioners.

The people of the parish are also quite willing volunteers. Unlike some other places I have served as pastor, here I have never yet had to waste hours of time trying (often in vain) to get helpers. No, at Fields of Grace the members are always quick to offer their assistance in whatever ways are needed. I probably don't need to tell you how much of a blessing that would be to your ministry should you be called to serve here.

Doing service work is a point of pride in the parish. Fields of Grace recently hosted a two-hour mobile food packing event for the Food for Kidz organization, and produced over 60 large boxes full. An outside fundraiser held at one of our churches—which many of our members helped organize and support—raised funds to help a local family whose mother recently developed cancer. Caring for people is part of the DNA at Fields of Grace. Relationships are treasured.

Each of the three churches that comprise Fields of Grace has a unique building which, in addition to being beautiful, is also very well-kept and maintained. All of the facilities are

debt-free, having long-ago been paid for. This fact enables the parish to operate with reasonable budgets which have been faithfully met over the years.

I hope, Pastor, that I have at least piqued your interest in Fields of Grace. Are things perfect in this parish? Of course not. There is still work to be done building the three-way partnership, especially regarding getting our members to harness the power of the parish and not focus too heavily on their individual congregations. Striving toward more consistent worship attendance and stewardship are some other areas in which there is room to grow. Every church body, including Fields of Grace, always has places in which to improve.

But, all-in-all, there are many, many positives which I hope will lead you to strongly consider Fields of Grace as (perhaps) a place to continue your ministry career. I have enjoved my time here immensely—and I'm convinced you would, too.
